

Program Overview and Objectives

This 1 1/2 day seminar features lectures and panel discussions on a variety of obesity-related medical and community issues. The program is designed for physicians, nurses and other allied health professionals involved in the care of obese patients. Upon completion of this seminar, participants should be able to:

- Foster multi-sector collaboration in the fight against obesity epidemic; practicing in the chronic care model.
- Engage communities in a process to foster healthy, active living through policy, systems and environmental changes.
- Provide a knowledge base that will contribute to the lifelong learning of metabolic and health care professionals to advance their performance, competency, discussing obesity with patients and achieve better outcomes.
- Improve the treatment and care of the Bariatric surgical patients.
- Understand and implement the expert committee obesity prevention and treatment guidelines by utilizing the 5210 Pediatric Obesity Clinical Decision Flipchart.
- Understand and implement the medical and behavior assessment and screening for pediatric overweight and obesity to identify related comorbidities.
- Understand and incorporate motivational interviewing into clinical practice.
